County Councillor Barrie Yates asked Lancashire County Council to support his Notice of Motion for Boys Need

Bins. Sanitary bins are now being put in every male toilet owned by Lancashire County Council. This means men can access the facilities in libraries, offices. schools and museums across the county. County Councillor Barrie Yates was alarmed to hear of struggles related to male incontinence.

Three to six million people in the UK experience urinary incontinence. It's often seen as a women's issue but one in twenty-five men aged over forty will

experience some form of urinary leakage every year, and one in twenty men aged sixty or over will experience bowel incontinence. As many as 69 per cent of men may experience urinary incontinence following surgery for prostate cancer, the most common cancer in men. Prostate Cancer UK is running the Boys Need Bins campaign. Councillor Yates was approached by a resident who had to line inside his briefcase with a plastic bag to take home his sanitary waste with him as there



was no wear in his workplace to dispose of sanitary waste.

County Councillor Yates said:" When I read about it all online, I thought that this should have been done years ago.

Men do not have direct access to sanitary bins and should be able to dispose of their incontinence products hygienically, safely, easily and with dignity wherever they go. My notice of motion was approved, and I was overwhelmed by the support of my fellow councillors. Work has now begun installing bins in all male toilets and all Councils and MPs have been asked to support Boys Need Bins across Lancashire." Community News Reporter. Road Resurfacing was completed in Councillor Barrie Yates's Division of South Ribble East on Wesley Street, Bamber Bridge, Hoghton Lane and Methuen Drive.

County Councillor Barrie Yates arranged for the road resurfacing of Hoghton Lane, Methuen Drive, Westley Street and Arrowsmith Drive, Road and Footpaths to be resurfaced very soon.

Westley Street to Stockdale Crescent, Bamber Bridge will have surfaced dressing treatment work to keep the roads in good condition.

Barrie has asked for more roads and footpaths resurfacing to be done in his Division of South Ribble East.

Barrie walks all around his area of South Ribble East checking for potholes and footpaths in need of repair, In the last fifteen months to July, Barrie has had sixteen roads resurfaced in 2024-25. He has raised over 620 concerns with highways reporting potholes and footpaths in need of repair of which 605 have now been repaired. He has also reported 272 road gullies that required cleaning with 260 completed and 12 programmed to be cleaned.

Barrie said, "I have asked for more roads and footpaths in my division to be repaired or resurfaced and they will be, but they have to be done in priority order." A big thank you to Lancashire Council Highways Team for a job well done.

Residents are concerned that our once beautiful Duck Pond, opposite the Brownedge War Memorial, is overgrown & looking completely unloved. Many people remember 'feeding the Ducks' with their children years ago, but these days you are more likely to see discarded beer cans. Councillor Jeff Couperthwaite said, "I have started enquiring who owns the former 'Baxi site pond' so that I can request an urgently required cleanup". SRBC passed the application for houses on the Baxi land that included the duck pond but has failed to ensure that it was maintained for the benefit of Bamber Bridge Residents. The leader of SRBC, Paul Foster, who is also the Ward Councillor has been asked why this duck pond has been allowed to get overgrown and full of litter. Paul Foster replied, this is a ongoing saga, that Officers are dealing with and will sort-out asap. I have also reported pruning of the roadside hedges on the Church side so that families don't have to walk on the busy road.



The road will be resurfaced from Hodson Street to Eaveswood Close, which is more than I asked for! This is fantastic news for the residents of Bamber Bridge. More good news is that Collins Road North will also be included in this round of road resurfacing. Resident Lisa Gildert in particular, keeps Jeff updated. Jeff knows there is still much work to be done, particularly the likes of Co-Operative Street, Irongate and now Duddle Lane. Residents should know he won't rest until they are all resurfaced. Update on the development of a new second home for Lancashire Cricket. Work on the site at Farington in central Lancashire is progressing well. Despite challenging

weather conditions, the major earthworks programmes are well underway, drainage systems have been established and the access road to the future pavilion building and the outline of the professional county pitch are now clearly visible. This is an innovative partnership between Lancashire County Council and Lancashire Cricket to deliver high-quality professional facilities for the club in Lancashire and an asset for the local community and wider county The England and Wales Cricket Board provided £1.6m in funding towards the development of the new facility. The England and Wales Cricket Board provided £1.6m in funding towards the development of the new facility. County Councillor Williamson said: "This pioneering facility is one of a kind in the UK. We're excited by this dynamic project, which will transform the sport

here in Lancashire. I'm especially happy that this will be a North West Centre of Excellence for women's cricket, paving the way for the next generation of top cricketers. The pioneering development will see first-class men's and women's cricket brought to a permanent new second home. When completed, natural amphitheatres will provide up to 5,000 spectators the opportunity to watch games. The site will serve as a North West Centre of Excellence for the women's game, and provide a stable pathway for the next generation of men's and women's and youth players Emirates Old Trafford will continue to host major matches, and the new facility will become Lancashire Cricket's second ground. The development will provide two pitches, one professional and one for the community, providing significant opportunities for local and community cricket to take place in the heart of Lancashire. The project will importantly create jobs for local people during construction and once the facility is up and running and provide an economic boost through business supply chains.


