German's Christmas Eve Doodlebug Bomb Destroyed Cottages & Hen House in Hoghton.

CHRISTMAS Eve 1944 would be a day that residents living around Gregson Lane would never forget and not for the usual reasons of festive cheer and goodwill to all men. At 5.28 am, sleeping villagers were awoken by a massive explosion in a field behind two cottages near Hewn Gate Farm. A deadly German V1 flying bomb 'doodlebug' left a 40-foot crater after

scoring a direct hit on a hen house. The direct hit on a hen cabin containing some 30 hens, the detonation obliterating the wooden cabin and no trace of the hens could be found other than a few feathers. Such was the force of the blast that the two cottages were lifted from their foundations. The upper floor collapsed, trapping the occupants among the debris, but no one was seriously injured. The cottages were later demolished. The present owner of the farm recalls that all the windows facing the

blast were blown in and the internal doors to those rooms were torn off their hinges. Also, the roof was badly damaged and several out-building had their roofs blown off. Another resident recalled a signal box at the nearby railway crossing and at the instant the V1 exploded, the occupant had popped around the back to answer a call of nature, had he been at his post he would have been killed, as the glass front was blown in. Considering that it was a single rocket-propelled bomb which had landed, the collateral damage was extensive. Over 100 homes, two mills, two pubs and a railway signal box were damaged with one of the mills having around 500 panes of glass blown out by the force of the nearby explosion. Although much of the crater has been filled in over time, it is still possible to spot a small depression in the field where the VI landed all those years ago.

Military historians have two theories as to why Hoghton had suddenly become a target of

one of Hitler's deadliest weapons. One was that the Germans were targeting Manchester

but the bomb went astray. The other was that the target was much closer to home, namely the Royal Ordnance Factory at Chorley. At the crater, several letters marked V1 POW Post were also found. This was a common trick used by the Nazis to tempt unwary folk to write to the fake prisoners revealing where the bomb had fallen. East Lancashire was relatively unscathed from Luftwaffe attacks during the Second World War. The considerable damage caused by just one bomb demonstrates how devastating a concerted bombing raid could have been. Community News Reporter, Graham Dixon.

Bamber Bridge Accident on Zebra Crossing.

County Councillor Jeff Couperthwaite praised local resident Alan Hudson for eporting the state of the Zebra on which the fatal accident occurred the other week at Longbrook Ave in Bamber Bridge.

He praised LCC Highways too, for swift action in response.

This was the LCC response 'Good afternoon county Councillor Couperthwaite, Thank you for your email dated 21 October 2024, on behalf of Mr Alan Hudson, regarding the faded zebra

crossing on Station Road, near to Longbrook Avenue, Bamber Bridge I am aware of the terrible incident Mr Hudson refers to. Incidents such as this can be very upsetting for all concerned. The police do share injury collision data with us, which helps us to identify locations where we can have the greatest measurable impact.

It would not be appropriate for us to comment on this particular

incident, or its likely causes In light of your email, our officers inspected the site and agreed that both the Zebra crossing and the mini roundabout would benefit from being refreshed.

We carried out these works on 27 October 2024 County Councillor

Cowperthwaite commented 'No **Excuses now.. this** crossing is clearly


